


Extensions Studio

- We are excited to offer full day programming in select schools for children in their Kindergarten year.
- The **Kindergarten Program** is half day and has an **Extensions Program** offered for the other half of the day to create a full day of programming.
- The **Kindergarten Program** is taught by a certified teacher and is based on Alberta Education's Program of Studies.
- The **Extensions program** is provided by an Early Childhood Educator (ECE) that guides meaningful play experiences and is based on Flight: Alberta's Early Learning and Care Framework, as an anchor for the program.





WHAT IS THE EXTENSIONS PROGRAM Innovation in programming

- Supports children in Kindergarten to gain access to a full day of programming.
- Complements the Kindergarten program by nurturing children's natural motivation to learn about their world.
- Delivered by an Early Childhood Educator and uses FLIGHT – the Alberta Early Learning and Care Curriculum Framework to make meaning on the learning that is occurring.

What is FLIGHT?

- Alberta Early Learning and Care Curriculum Framework document is a project supported by the Alberta government and implemented provincially.
- The result of the collaborative effort of a variety of advisory committees, professional and community agencies, academic institutions and government agencies.
- Highlights the relationships and curriculum decisions shaping responsive practices in early learning communities.




The Vision of Flight

- Inspired by the vision of strong active and energetic childhood communities – **Places of Vitality**
- Play, learning and development are nurtured as educators work within a **Practice of Relationships**
- Nurtures children's identity as strong, resourceful **Mighty Learners and Citizens**
- Reflects on the everyday experiences of children that forms the basis of **Curriculum Meaning Making**



Designing a Program

- Room design is based off the values of the learning community.
- The room is planned with intentionality and alongside the children.
- Materials are chosen for children to engage with freely to construct meaning.
- Enriched centres are used to create deep connections, critical thinking and reflective observations.
- Material choices focus on long term projects that are child-centred, and promote inquiry and discovery through play.

Discovery and Inquiry Experiences



- Children engage in active play in a variety of enriched centres and that support learning with experimentation and long-term projects.

Dramatic Play


- Dramatic play and active play are a natural fit as children move in the studio to act out the stories they imagine.
- Reciprocal relationships are also developed as we become active players in the story.






Active Play

- Understanding the need for children to engage in active, physical, full body play is an important part to nurturing social and emotional learning
- Giving opportunity to understand the where, as well as the when, is an important part to support children in critically thinking about how they affect their environment





Calm Spaces

- Seclusion and intimacy can be equally important to children.
- We find quiet spots in the room like under or in the loft to create cozy, quiet moments to hide away and regroup





Sensory Stimulation

- Soothing, tension relieving spaces give children the freedom to take in information through sight, sound, taste and touch
- Natural elements of nature that include earth, light, air and water are important contributors to developing effective sensory experiences and spaces
